1 Installation

1.1 Linux

Backup your current `~/.emacs.d` with the following command:

```
#+BEGIN_SRC: emacs-lisp mv ~/emacs.d ~/emacs.d.bkp #+END_SRC
```

Clone my configuration folder to your home directory:

```
#+BEGIN_SRC: emacs-lisp cd ~ git clone https://github.com/Blendoit/.emacs.d.git #+END_SRC
```

2 Main Files

2.1 init.el

- This file's only purpose is to load my literate configuration.

2.2 blendoit/init-blendoit.org

- Load my personal literate configuration files.

2.3 blendoit/custom-file.el

- By default, all customization options available in Emacs' GUI that can be saved with **Options - Save Options** are saved here.
- This is useful to fool around with GUI customization options, without breaking our manually written code.
